This Institute, which was founded by the British Red Cross Society, and which is now part of the Middlesex Hospital, affords facilities for the advice and treatment of sufferers from rheumatism and its allied conditions (sciatica, arthritis, lumbago, muscular rheumatism, neuritis, etc.). Such patients should be able to attend regularly as out-patients-probably two or three times a week. There is no in-patient accommodation in the Institute, as this is provided by the Middlesex Hospital and other hospitals as beds are available.

CONSULT ATIONS

Before receiving treatment, every patient is examined at the first attendance by a member of the Honorary Medical Staff. EXAMINA-TIONS ARE ARRANGED BY APPOINTMENT ONLY. Such appointments CANNOT be given until a prospective patient has sent or brought a doctor's recommendation. An application form has also to be completed.

TREATMENT APPOINTMENTS

Treatment can rarely be arranged on the same day as the consultation. Patients can, when making appointments, be advised of the length of time such treatments will take and strict punctuality in arrival should be observed in the interests of others.

Patients are asked to notify the Institute by letter or telephone whenever they are unable to attend at the time reserved for them. This is particularly requested in order that these appointments may be given to other patients.

PRIVATE PATIENTS

There is no Private Patients' Department at the Institute. The Physicians make appointments to see Private Patients in their own consulting rooms and where necessary arrange appropriate treatment in conjunction with the Institute. Fees are payable for this treatment and charges will be made known to those concerned.

How to get to the Institute

The entrance to Peto Place, which is a small cul-de-sac running northwards out of the Marylebone Road, lies almost opposite the Great Portland Street Underground Station.

The following buses pass this station : 1, 3, 18B, 30, 27A, 53, 137, 153.

Besides the Great Portland Street Station, which is served by the District and Metropolitan Lines, the following stations are close at hand :

REGENT'S PARK (Bakerloo Line) - 250 yards away. There is a lift

at this station and not a moving staircase.

WARREN STREET (Northern Line) - 1/2 mile. Walk westwards down the Marylebone Road or take a 30 bus.

OXFORD CIRCUS (Bakerloo and - 3 mile. Walk northwards along Great Portland Street or take a 53 bus.

Patients using the Piccadilly Line should change at Piccadilly Circus on to the Bakerloo Line and come to Regent's Park Station.
