The Auctioneer reserves to himself the right of refusing the bidding of any person, and the right to withdraw, consolidate, or divide any lot or lots, and to submit the lots in any order, without regard to the number or position of the same in the Catalogue, as may be deemed advisable. A reserve price may be placed on any of the lots by the Vendors and they may bid more than once for any lot by themselves or an agent.

2.—No person to advance less than one shilling at each bidding, above two pounds, two shillings; above five pounds, five shillings, and so on in proportion, or the Auctioneer may settle the rate of bidding.

3.—The Purchasers to give in their names and places of abode, and to pay down on the fall of the hammer, a deposit of five shillings in the pound, in part payment of the purchase-money, and, if required, to pay the whole amount of purchase-money of any lot; in default of which the lot or lots so purchased to be immediately put up again and re-sold.
