



This important unpublished manuscript contains a copy of Baker's appointment as Consul General, also an account of his journey from London to Plymouth, where he went aboard for his passage to Tripoli, and descriptions of events at several places along the Mediterranean. Following this are accounts of the events during the six years of his ministration, in which are found copies of six letters between him and Samuel Pepys. These letters from Pepys are not to be found in any of his published correspondence, and therefore add great interest to this volume. There are other letters from Charles II and Lord Chandos of Sudeley, Ambassador at Constantinople.

He styles it "only the rude rubble and out-cast rubbish (as you know) of a greater and more serious work," i.e., his "Britannia." On page 8 of "Certaine Poemes, or Poesies, Epigrammes, Rhythmes, and Epitaphs of the English Nation in former Times" is to be found the passage, "These may suffice for some Poeticall descriptions of our auncient Poets, if I would come to our time, what a world could I present to you out of Sir Philipp Sidney, Ed. Spencer, Samuel Daniel, Hugh Holland, Ben Johnson, Th. Campion, Mich. Drayton, George Chapman, John Marston, WILLIAM Shakespeare, & other most pregnant witts of these our times." On page 13 in the article on Languages, "And howsoever our Indian or American discoverers say, that in every fourscore mile in America, and in every valley almost of Peru you shall finde a new language."
