The first part is complete, but the second part lacks two leaves, G and G². However like all early school books, this work is extremely rare, most editions in the S.T.C. and Wing being represented by a single copy only, and the EXISTENCE OF A COPY OF THE EDITION HERE LISTED HAS NOT HITHERTO BEEN ABLE TO BE RECORDED, AND APART FROM SMALL BLEMISHES THE ORNATE CONTEMPORARY MOROCCO BINDING IS IN REMARKABLY FINE STATE.

This is an extremely important and valuable book for the history of education as it sets out the standards of attainment required for promotion from one form to the next and for election to the university, and then goes on to give in detail the examination requirements of Classes 1 to 4. Apart from the title, our copy collates similarly with the one in Edinburgh University, and it was recently exhibited at the *English at School* Exhibition held by the National Book League. The existence of this 1661 edition was unknown to Mr. Wing who kindly gave us the information about the two copies of the 1652 edition. Dugard had been Headmaster of Merchant Taylors School until his removal by the governors, and was probably responsible for the examination set out here. A VERY RARE AND INTERESTING VOLUME.

The imprint differs from the edition of 1698 recorded by Wing L. 1857 where he lists only the Cambridge and Harvard copies. This is virtually a reprint, with some changes, of *The Children's Petition* 1669, a very rare and interesting little pamphlet of which Wing records only the B.M. copy, although another copy from a private collection was shown at *The English at School Exhibition*, and it gives important details about the history of the publication of that *Petition* not included in the first edition. It is a strong plea for more moderate and less indiscriminate chastisement and for the abatement of the "salacious pay masters take of us and not from us," and gives first hand accounts from "victims" of their beatings, and describes the methods and instruments of chastisement. Marcus Forcius, a Roman tribune, prefer'd a law that no Roman citizen should be beaten with rods. The renowned Dr. Busby of Westminster school, famous for the way he could "lay it on," here gives his views on the original edition of the *Petition*.

G. Jones in writing her notable book, *The Charity School Movement in the Eighteenth Century*. These schools were the main source of education for poor children for 170 years.
