





The most curious edition is com-monly the First, and the most useful may be selected amongst the last. Thus of Tully's Offices, the edition of Fust is the most curious, and that of Greevius the most useful. The most splendid the eye will discover," etc.

This truly magnificent letter extends to 9 pp. 4to., and is full of instructions and advice to Mr. Barnard before he sets out for the Continent, to buy Books, discussing with great wealth of detail the Books which he is likely to find in different countries, the Classes of Books he should obtain, details of individual Editions, Presses, former ownership of Books and their Bindings, the celebrated early Printers, the possibility of there being undiscovered editions of the Bible earlier in date than those recorded by Bibliographers—in fact every consideration that could occur to a man setting out on such an important and responsible quest is here reviewed and discussed. These Letters, which might well be termed "The Royal Book-Collector's Vade Meoum," should certainly find a final resting place among the treasures of the King's Library, at the British Museum, to which many refer
