A most interesting item, the American artist, Du Sumitieri, having brought duplicate sets of his drawings, and sold them to the rival publishers. The above consists of the thirteen portraits published by Richardson, and the twelve by Rodd. The latter publisher, for some reason, possibly from not having been supplied with it by the artist, did not issue the portrait of Arnold, which is contained in Richardson's Series.

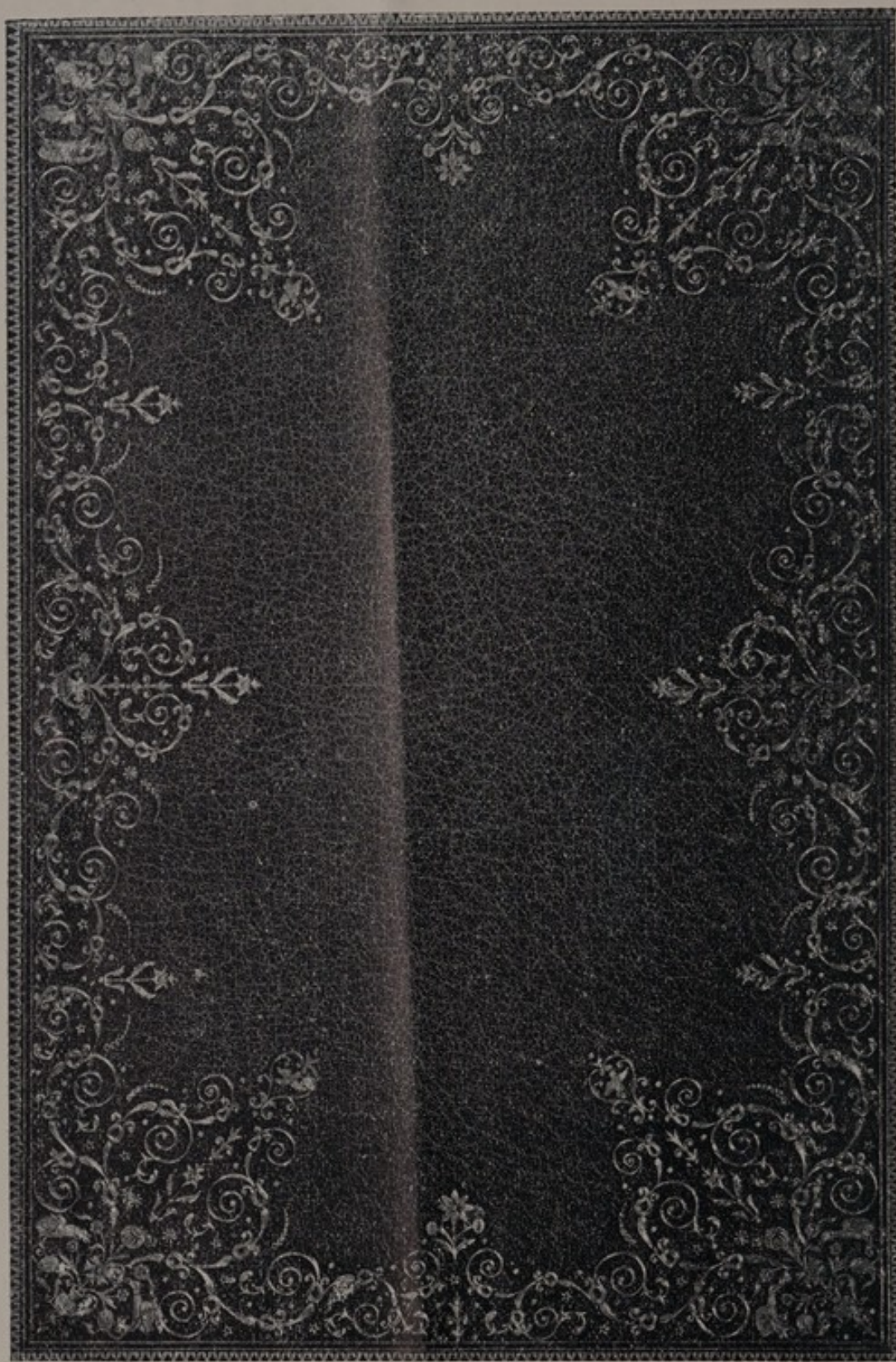
