DIRECTIONS.

The Compartments of this Box are numbered and arranged in the order in which their contents will be wanted.

- 1 To stop bleeding bind the india-rubber tube tightly round the limb, between the wound and the body.
- 2 Pick away pieces of clothes, dirt, &c., with forceps : The scissors may be wanted at any point in the dressing.
- 3 Wipe away blood, dirt, &c., with swabs. If grease is about wound and skin, thoroughly soak swab in car's petrol and wash it off. Car's petrol must not be used in artificial light.

- 4 Iodine. Break this bottle by hitting it hard with a single nail until it splits to pour out.

Then spread the paste gently over wound first, and then over parts around, by means of swabs on clips.

- 5 Cover up wound thus prepared by wrapping it round with the gauze.

- 6 Fix gauze on by bandages and strapping, as case may be.
