## CASE I.

JOSEPH MERRET, now an Under Gardener to the Earl of Berkeley, lived as a Servant with a Farmer near this place in the year 1770, and occafionally affifted in milking his mafter's cows. Several horfes belonging to the farm began to have fore heels, which Merret frequently attended. The cows foon became affected with the Cow Pox, and foon after feveral fores appeared on his hands. Swellings and ftiffnefs in each axilla followed, and he was fo much indifpofed for feveral days as to be incapable of purfuing his ordinary employment. Previoufly to the appearance of the diffemper among the cows there was no frefh cow brought into the farm, nor any fervant employed who was affected with the Cow Pox.

In April, 1795, a general inoculation taking place here, Merret was inoculated with his family; fo that a period of twenty-five years had elapfed from his having the Cow Pox
