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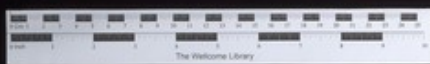
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Red, White, & Green

Society of Friends in 1840.






June 1880.

of age, and took prize at fair at Dixmont about
