Stook a proppy a mouth old and placed it on a friese of wood surrounded by water over which Thut a glass cover so as to prevent the access of atmosphase Hir in ten minutes he showed great marks of unea - sweets in 12 respiration because difficult, and in 17 hunter ceased altogether, at 18 Minutes Stook If one of the lans, which was not followed by humorrhage, besiviation soon returned and the arrival bid not appear to be the least sensible of pain in three days the Ear was perfectly healed Jaur days after the same puppy was exposed to a decomposition of the carbonate of hime by sulformie acid, In I Minute responation ceased Scut of the other lar which was follows by very trifling hemonhage, and as before did not appear to suffer any pain, in four days the wound healed the day after the operation he seemed to require an additional quantity of food, which induced me to weigh him and Journ he gained 9 ts. 18 24 grains in 9 days Stook the same puffy and proceeded as in Exp. 1- and respiration was acted on in much the same manner Sout of the tail and made an incision over the muscles of the loins through which Spafsed a ligatione and made it tight. No appearance of uneasiness untit the day fol. · lowing, when inflammation came on and on the yth day and the day is remarkely increased in size and now perfectly well
