Cleopatra's Period.
Second molar lost before death.
Roots of remaining teeth partly bare.



Ancient Egyptian Mandible. Abrasion on right first molar...pulp exposed.



Gizeh Pyramid
Crown of first molar completely destroyed
by caries. Alveolar wall disappeared
during life, bone underneath partly
eaten away... signs of chronic
inflammation.
