By the King.

A Proclamation for the better ordering of those who repayre to the Court, for their cure of the disease called the Kings Euill.



Hereas by the grace and blessing of God, the Kings and Queenes of this Realme, by many ages path, have had the happinesse, by their sacred touch and innocation of the Name of God, to ture those, who are afflicted with the discase called the Kings Euill. And his now most Excellent Pauchte, in no tesse measure then any of his Royall products so, bath had good successe herein, and in his most gracious and plous disposition is as ready and willing, as any King or Queene of this Realme ever was, in any thing to relieve the distresses and necessities of his good Subjects; Pet in his Princely wiscome soresieing that in this, (as in all other things) order is to be observed, and sit times are

the both hereby publish and declare his Royall will spleakure to bee. That whereas herework the bluall times of prefenting such persons to his Dately for this purpose, were Caster and whitsuntide. That from henceforth the times shall bee Caster and Dichaelmas, as times more convenient, both for the temperature of the kason, and in respect of any contagion, which may haps pen in this neere access to his Patelies sacred Person. And his Datelie both accordingly will and command. That from the time of publishing this Proclamation, none presume to repayre to his Patelies Royall Court to bee healed of that disale, before the Feast of S. Michael now next comming. And his Datelie doeth further will and command. That all such as hereafter thall come or repayre to the Court for this purpose, shall bring with them Certificates under the hands of the Patson, Clicar, or Dimiter and Church wardens of those severall particles where they dwell, and from whence they come, tellifying according to the trueth, that they have not any time before bene touched by the King, to the intent to be healed of that disale. And his Paielie doth thraitly charge all Justices of the Peace. Constables and other officers, That they doe not suffer any to passe, but such as have such Certificates, by on pame of his Paielies displeasure. And to the end that all his sowing Subjects may the better take knowledge of this his Paielies pleasure and command. His will is, that this Proclamation be published, and affixed in some open place in every Parket Towns of this Realme.

Giuen at His Maiesties Court at White-hall, the eighteenth day of Inne, in the second yeere of His Reigne of Great Britaine, France, and Ireland.
