The Collection is still preserved at KERSALL CELL, his property and residence during his later years, and now in the possession of his lineal descendant. It has been thought so curious and valuable, as a transcript of his mind and studies, and many of the books contained in it are now so seldom to be found, even in the most extensive libraries, that a Catalogue of them has been prepared, under the care and superintendence of Mr. RODD, of which a few copies are now printed for private distribution. Perhaps a more appropriate tribute could not be paid to the memory of one so learned, gifted, and benevolent, than by exhibiting to the world the varied stores from whence he drew the cultivation of his mind, the formation of his character, and the inspirations of his genius.

The volume commences on a ij and extends to y vi: k has only six leaves. There is no sheet l: all the others are in eights, except a, of which the first leaf was probably blank. It is of considerable interest, as presenting one of the earliest books from the Oxford press. The register is very unevenly printed throughout. The present copy is in fine sound condition, but is slightly water-stained. Mr. Byrom has written his name on the first leaf of the book, and on the top of the same page is written "Orate pro anima Edmūdi Crofton," who is probably the writer of a marginal gloss extending to e iiij, which appears to be of the early part of the sixteenth century. On the last leaf is the autograph of "Raffe Kyrkhm."

This Manuscript appears to be of the early part of the XVth century. It is written in a very neat small English gothic character. Unfortunately it is imperfect both at the beginning and the end: the covers having been lost, the first and last leaves of the volume have suffered so much as to render them nearly illegible.

(EVANGELIA IN DOMINICIS ET FESTIS) of the XVth century, *upon vellum* . . . small folio

This is a Manuscript of Lessons for the Sundays and Saints' Days, for the use of some English church, probably that of Sarum.

It is written in a fine bold gothic character, with floreated illuminated capitals. The rubrics have in many places been defaced, apparently at the time of the reformation, and in accordance with the King's Proclamation for abolishing the usurped power of the Pope, June 1534 (see it in *Fox, Acts and Monuments*; also in *Wilkins, Concilia*), as the names of Popes and Saints are scratched through.

The musical notes are given to several of the services. Mr. Byrom has written his name on the inner cover, on the first leaf, and again at the end: and in various parts of the book are found the names of the following former possessors of the volume: Fulke Walwyne, James Madewell, Willmus Howarde, Willhelus Cooke.

(HORÆ). A Book of Prayers of the XVth century, *written upon vellum* . . . 4to

The first leaf is wanting, but the deficiency is supplied by a leaf from another Manuscript.

It has ten illuminations, representing the interview of St. Ann and the Virgin, the Crucifixion, Pentecost, the Nativity, the Angels appearing to the Shepherds, the Wise Men's Offering, the Circumcision, the Flight into Egypt, David's Repentance, the Vigils for the Dead, each within an ornamented border: the whole in a coarse style of French art. Several of the Prayers are in French.

This Manuscript is evidently by an English scribe, and probably for the service of the English church. The writing is a good clear gothic, the notes in black, upon four red lines. It has belonged to some eminent scholar in the sixteenth century, who has inserted in the margins the names of the authors of the words, and the metres in which the hymns are composed.

The writer to whom they are here assigned was a follower of Behmen in the last century, and the writing bears a striking similarity to some of his acknowledged works still remaining in manuscript in the library of the British Museum. An advertisement for his lost Manuscripts appeared in *The Times* newspaper in the year 1846.

He has not written his name at length, but in volume the 3d, on the last page, occur some initials as follows, J. + C. Amen : and on the last page of the first volume occur the following capitals, H. S. J. +
Amen, Js.

The above title occurs at page 8, and the preceding pages are occupied with what is generally termed the early experience of the writer. His name does not appear, but from the circumstances he narrates to have occurred in the tenth, eleventh, and eighteenth years of his age, and his speaking of others which fell out ten or eleven years subsequent, with their date of 1667 in the margin, it would appear that he was born about the year 1639. A perusal of his volumes would probably afford some biographical notices, so as to lead to the identification of the melancholy visionary who has here chronicled his extatic visions at full. Some Hymns are interspersed, more remarkable for their piety than the poetry.

The writing is in a good clear hand, and the work appears to have been corrected by the author, with a view to publication.

Mr. Byrom has written his name in the inner cover of the first volume, with a memorandum of his having "bo't at Mr. Gyles, Booksale, after his death, 1742, with 5 other volumes;" and added the price he paid in short-hand cyphers.

This Manuscript is of considerable interest on account of the language as well as the subject. As regards the first, it exhibits the Saxon form in a more pure and unmixed state than is generally presented to us in works of so recent a period, as may be gathered from the plural termination of the nouns in the above title.

From the nature of the subjects treated of, and the great extent of the work, it necessarily contains a most copious vocabulary of the language as existing at the time, especially of the scientific and technical words; and a perusal of it would unquestionably well repay the student in English Archaiology.

With respect to the subject, it affords a complete view of surgical science as existing at the period, and in a history of the progress of that science is a work of considerable importance. The Manuscript being incomplete at the end, we do not find the name of the translator, which would probably have appeared in the colophon.

On the bottom margin occur the shield of arms of the person for whom the Manuscript was executed, but it is unfortunately so much defaced as to render it impossible to identify it. The binding appears to be Venetian, of the early part of the sixteenth century, if not coeval with the book; old red turkey morocco richly stamped and gilt. On the centre a shield bearing a bird, apparently a falcon, over which is stamped a coronet.
