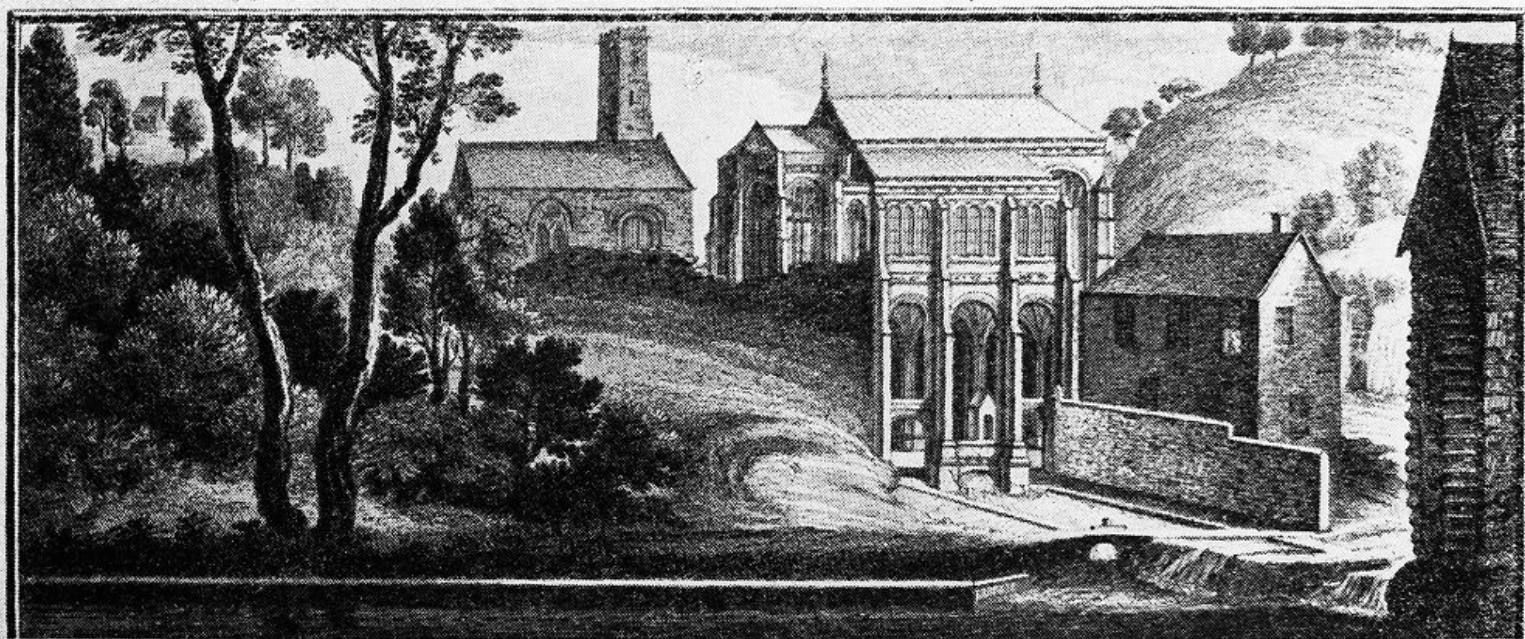

THE NORTH VIEW OF ST WINEFRED'S WELL & CHAPEL, IN THE COUNTY OF FLINT.



THIS Well is situated in the North part of the County, between the River Eire, and the Town of Caerwys; in a Lordship belonging to S^r Edm^d Clerton Bar^t. The Water here of breaks out with such a rapid Stream, as within a small Distance is able to turn several Mills. Many Virtues are ascribed to the Water of this Spring; over the Head of which, was built a Chapel, dedicated to S^t Winefred. The present Colfax, was erected in the time of King Hen. III. In a Window of the Chancel hereof, was formerly to be seen the Portraiture of the said Virgin, with memorials of her Life and Death. The present Proprietor of this Place is Robert Davies Esq^r. —
