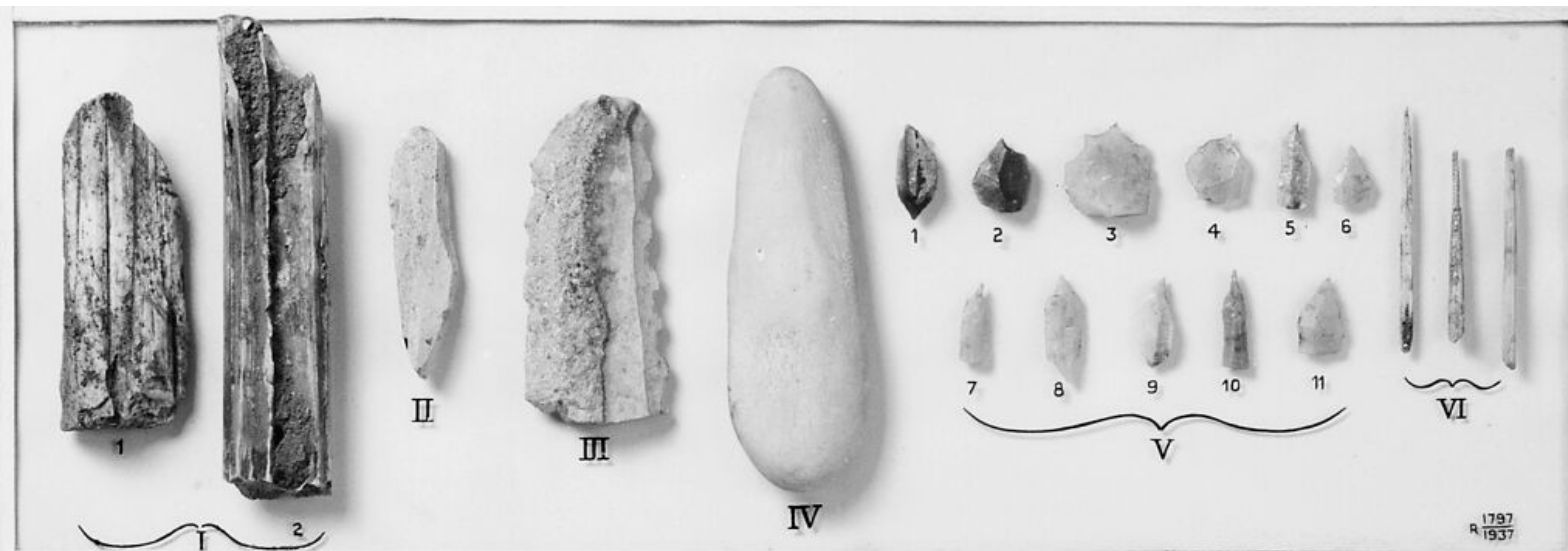

2. BONE FROM WHICH SPLINTERS HAVE BEEN TAKEN.
- II. GRAVER (*BURIN*) FOR CUTTING GROOVES.
- III. TOOTHED TOOL FOR ROUNDING SPLINTERS.
- IV. HONE FOR SMOOTHING AND POINTING.
- V. 1. SMALL GRAVERS. 2-11. AWLS FOR DRILLING THE EYE.
- VI. NEEDLES: WHOLE, FROM BRUNIQUEL (TARN-ET-GARONNE); FRAGMENTARY, FROM OTHER LOCALITIES IN SOUTH-WESTERN FRANCE.
