DRUG JARS: English delftware

English delftware drug jars were used for storing and dispensing medicines. They were often decorated with labels and crests, and some were made in the shape of animals or other figures. The jars were made of white earthenware and were fired in a kiln. The labels were often made of paper or leather and were pasted onto the jars. The crests were often painted on the jars and were often of the royal coat of arms.
