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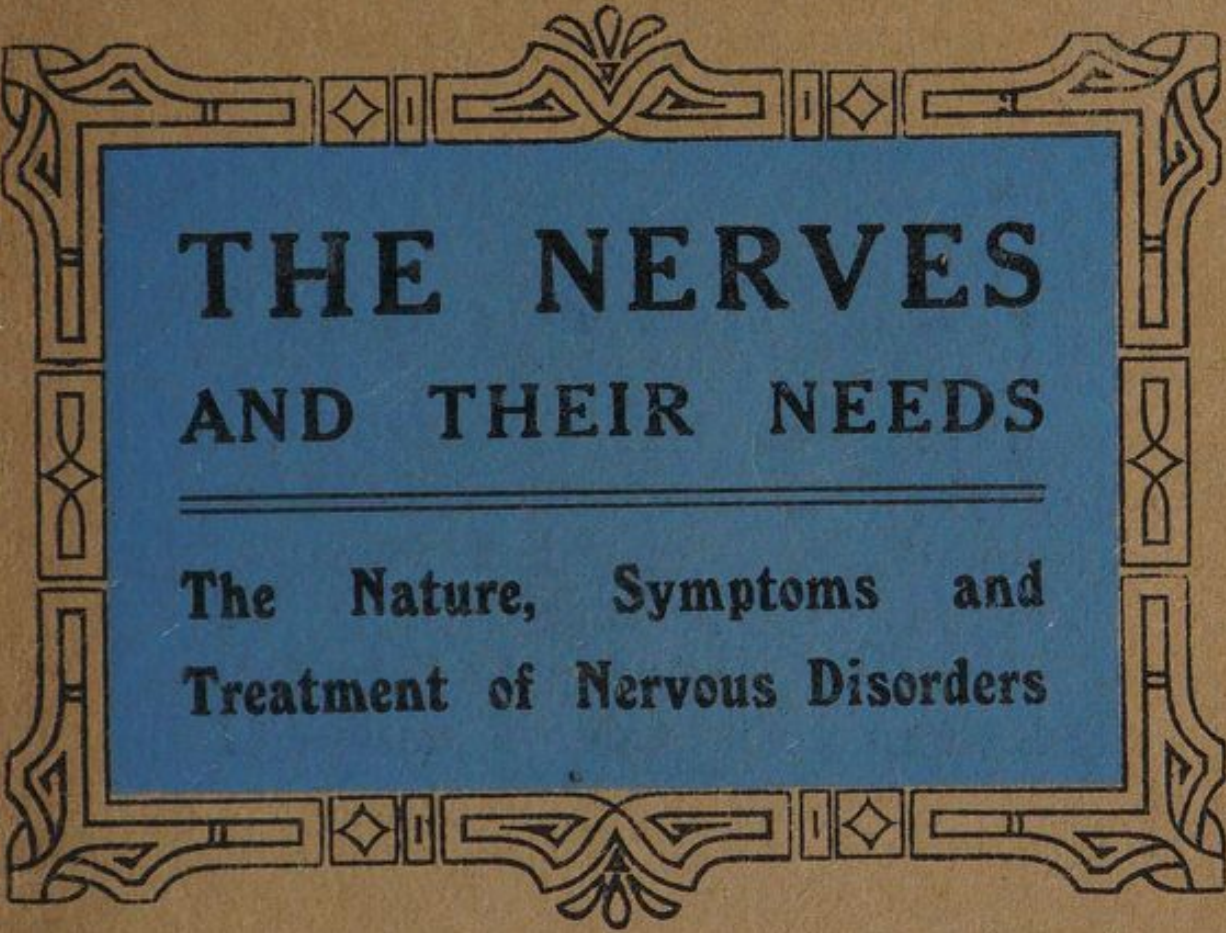

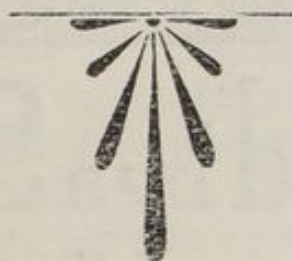

THE NERVOUS SYSTEM.

The nervous system is the governing and controlling system of the body. The nerves go to every part of the body, and every form of work that the different organs do is directed by them. Every one of them is almost constantly taking messages of sensation to the brain, or conveying orders of motion to some portion of the body and supplying it with the necessary energy.

Those nerves which convey feeling of hot or cold, painful or pleasant sensations, etc., are called the afferent or sensory nerves, and those by which we are enabled to move different parts of the body are the efferent or motory nerves. These all centre either in the brain or in the spinal column, and are always in pairs—one sensory and one motory.

Thirty-one pairs of nerves issue from the spinal cord, and twelve from the lower part of the brain. At the side and from the back-bone is a double chain of nerve cells (ganglia) which, with the countless nerves extending from it, are known as the sympathetic system; these nerves connect with the vital parts of the body, the heart, lungs, blood-vessels, etc., and with the spinal and cranial nerves over the body. By means of this, the entire system is united, and the brain with its nervous system is brought into close connection with every portion of the body.

NERVOUS DISEASES.

Nervous diseases are directly due to the failure of the nerves to do their work properly or to some temporary or permanent damage to their structure. As the nerves receive from the blood all of their nourishment to keep up their energy and to repair their waste or damage, the importance of pure, red blood to the health of the nerves is seen at once. The nerves, like all

other tissues of the body, use their stored up energy when at work, and become exhausted if overworked. The blood, when healthy, makes this good, and keeps the nerves strong and well. If, however, the blood is impure, as it frequently becomes through overwork, worry, poor digestion, and many other causes, the nerves fail to receive their full supply of nourishment, and breakdown or disease results. This, briefly stated, is the cause of most nervous disorders.

ST. VITUS' DANCE.

St. Vitus' Dance may appear at any age, but it is most often met with between the ages of six and fourteen.

The most frequent cause of the disease is poverty of the blood, called by the doctors an anæmic condition. With the blood anæmic, an attack of St. Vitus' Dance is often hastened by fright, grief, long-continued study at school, or rheumatism. The disease is, therefore, a striking example of a nervous trouble that is caused by poor blood, and cured by building up the blood.

St. Vitus' Dance occurs most often in the spring months, between March and July. This is probably because the young sufferers have been confined indoors during the winter without sufficient exercise, and have been under mental strain at school. Under these conditions the blood becomes impoverished, fails to carry

nourishment to the nerves, and the child begins to show listlessness and inattention. Then it becomes restless, and twitching of the muscles and jerking of the limbs and the body follow. There may be intervals when the child will act naturally, but there is a gradual loss of control over movements, and the patient stumbles in walking, spills food and drink, and possesses no firm hold with the hands.

NEURALGIA.

Neuralgia is an irritation or inflammation of the nerves. Pain is the chief and often only symptom, and generally comes on with a feeling of weight or numbness. The pain is stabbing, darting, or burning, and rarely extends the whole length of the nerve. At the point where the pain is present, the skin is often very tender. In many cases the eyesight is affected, in others there is a spasm in the muscles along the diseased nerve. The attacks of the disease follow very closely changes of weather, exposure to cold being the most frequent cause of an attack.

There are a number of causes of Neuralgia, but a general run-down condition of the health is the most common. For this reason it is often associated with or follows anæmia, malaria, colds, influenza, rheumatism, and other weakening diseases. Neuralgia is an unfailing warning that the nervous system is feeble because of nerve starvation. The blood, which in normal health carries to the nerves all of their

nourishment, is unable to perform this duty properly when it is weak and impure.

The proper treatment for Neuralgia is to build up the strength and health of the body. A nourishing diet and tonic will accomplish this, but external applications as liniments cannot. Rest in bed, if possible, is a valuable aid in treatment.

SCIATICA.

Sciatica is Neuralgia of the sciatic nerve. Its origin is generally rheumatic, and is the direct result of taking cold. For this reason the disease is commonly known as "Sciatic Rheumatism."

Sciatica is one of the most painful diseases. In some cases the pain is knife-like, sharp or shooting; in others, dull and aching.

In a majority of cases sick or nervous headache is hereditary. The immediate cause, however, is lack of nutrition of the nerves. This nerve starvation is due to poisonous materials in the blood, because of some run-down condition of the body. body But it frequently happens that through grief, worry, digestive disturbances, eye strain, or mental or physical overwork, the blood becomes impure and the health run down. 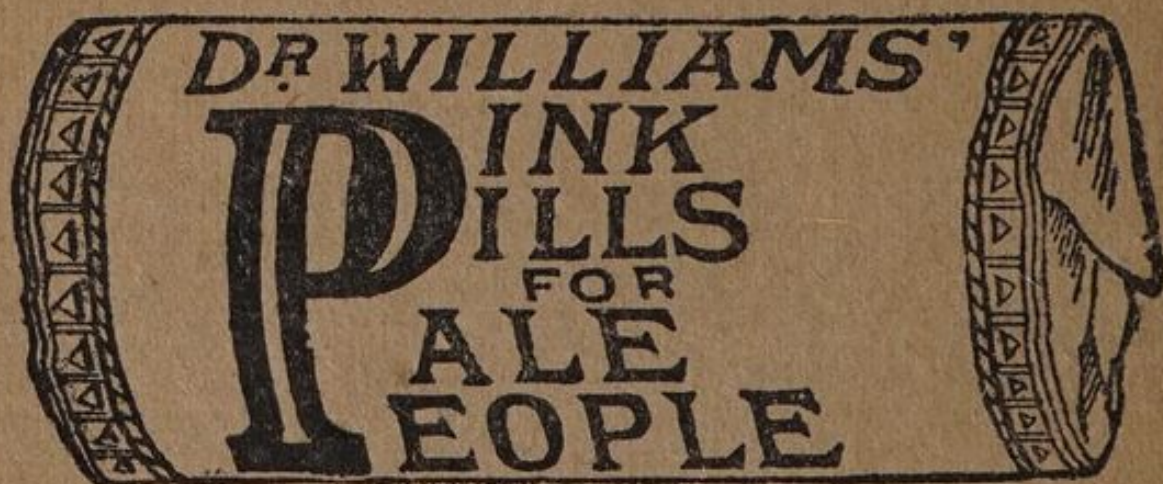
