WILLIAM WOODVILLE, M.D., F.R.S. (1752-1805)

Physician to the Smallpox Hospital and Medical Botanist. The objection by Edward Jenner to Woodville's results obtained at the hospital, estranged the two men. Woodville later admitted that the smallpox-like rashes that he had obtained, were, in fact, due to smallpox, and that there had been infection with smallpox at the same time as vaccination.
