

M0013075: Pages from The erection of an Academy in London for the Education of Her Majesties Wardes and others the youth of Nobility and Gentlemen, 1573

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Note

The Keeper after every māte shall cause the bringers of books into England to exhibit to him their Registers before they bring any to any other person that so may peruse the same and take receipt of same as the Academie shall want and shall make the one of the wardes or the Rector of the Academie known to his officers upon whose warrant the books so provided shall be payed for And there shall be yearly allowed for the buying of books for the said Library and other necessary instruments.

Note

The Printers in England shall for ever be charged to deliver into the Library of the Academie at their owne charge one copy well bounde of any book proclamation or pamphlet that they shall printe

Also there shall be one Treasurer of the Academie who shall yearly allowed for the same £ 100

Also there shall be one Rector of the said Academie who shall make to all of the nature and function of the wardes to spend that they may by his direction be employed principally in some profession regard to their nature doth most consern the one of the wardes being made yearly £ 100

Also the rest of the comite of wardes from time to time shall be the chiefest governor of the Academie because the oversight of wardes doth directly belong unto him & shall be yearly allowed for the same £ 200

Also there shall be given in store for the furnishing of a Library and instrumente pertaining to the same £ 2000
with the buying of hereto afforsaid and all other necessary thinges for the first furnishing of this Academie.

The aforesaid whole yearly wages and charges of this Academie amounteth unto £ 2507 6 8d

The whole yearly charge for the command of the said Readers officers and seruantes in this Academie amounteth unto £ 459 16 8d

which maketh yearly in all £ 3066 13 4d

There remaineth leavyed for the building or buying of houses for this Academie

Certaine orders to be obserued

At the Afore said publique Readers of arte and the common lawes shall
come within every six yeares set forth some new booke in printe according
to their severall professions

Also every one of these wch shall publiquely teache any of the langayages
and aforesaid shall once every 3 yeares publishe in printe some translation
into the English tongue of some good worke as neare as may be
for the aduancing of these Englyssh wch shalbe practized in the
said Academys

All wch booke shall for ever be entituled as set forth by the gentlemen
of Queene Elizabethes Academys whiche all the nations
of the world shal once every 6 yeares at the fronthost reueue
greate benefit to yo^r signes immortall fame

Also for ever the 7th day of September and the 17th day of November
there shalbe a Sermon in the Academys wherby the Auditory shall
put in minde what wch the founder thought. By whiche meanes the
memory of man shall write for ever in the care of the living to the honor of the dead.

There are divers necessarie thinges to be further considered of all wch
Your Majestie be resuled what to do herin

The commodities which will ensue
by erecting this Academys

In the present state of gentlemen cannot well traine up their children within this
Realme but either in Oxforder or Cambridge wherof this ensueth

First being therre they utterly losse their tyme & they doe not follow learning
only for therre is no other gentlemanlike qualitie to be attained

Also by the exmale of such, thos which wch wold apply their studiess are drawn
to licentiousnes and idlenes and therefore yet were evry way better if
they were to be in any other place then these
