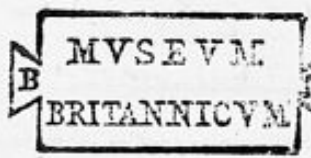

Forasmuch as (most excellent Sovereigne) the most part of noble men  
and gentlemen that happen to be your most excellent the custody of their  
bodies beinge if bounty granted to some in reward of service or otherwise  
not without your honorable confidence of their good education yet  
nevertheless most commonly by such to whom they are committed or by  
those to whom such Comittes have sold them being either of evil  
religion or insufficient qualities are thorough the default of their  
guardians for the most part brought <sup>in no small grief of their parents</sup> by in fortunes & lustrations  
pastime & stranged from all servitable vertues to their private and  
Country obscurely drowned in education for sparing charges of purpose  
to abuse their mindes leaste being better qualified they should deserve  
to stowe to the marriage of such purchasers Daughters As also for  
that the greatest number of young gentlemen within this Realme  
are most conversant aboute London where your most excellent  
hath most ordinarie residence It were good as I thinke under  
your most gracious correction that for the better  
education there should be an Academy erected in sort as  
followeth



First there shall be one Scholem who shall teache Grammar both greke  
and latine & shall yearly allowed for the same ~~40<sup>l</sup>~~ 40

Also there shall be allowed to him fower Others every of them being yearly  
allowed for the same 20<sup>l</sup> which maketh in the whole by the year 80

Also there shall be one who shall reade and teache the Hebrew tongue and  
shall yearly allowed for the same ~~50<sup>l</sup>~~ 50

Also there shall be one who shall both reade and teache both Logicke and  
Rhetorick & shall weekly on certen dayes therefore appointed see his scholars  
dispute and exercise the same & shall yearly allowed therefore 40
