SIR RONALD ROSS (1857-1932)
Pioneer in the study of malaria. In 1897, he discovered the mosquito as the vector of the parasite, and his work laid the foundation for the control of the disease.



SIR WILLIAM OSLER (1849-1937)
Pioneer of the modern hospital. He founded the first medical school in England, and his work led to the development of the modern hospital system.
