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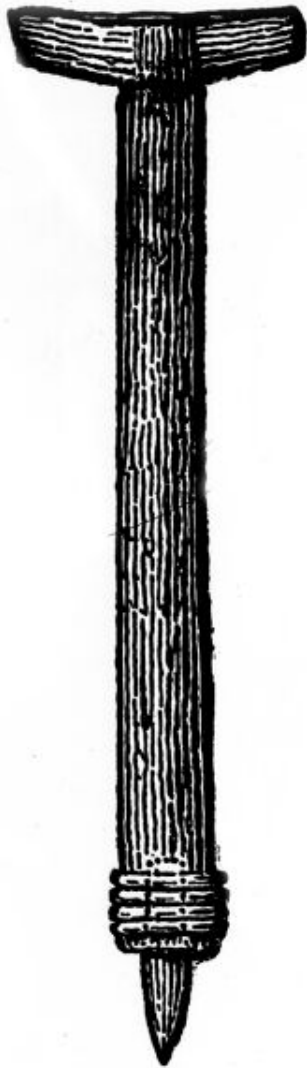
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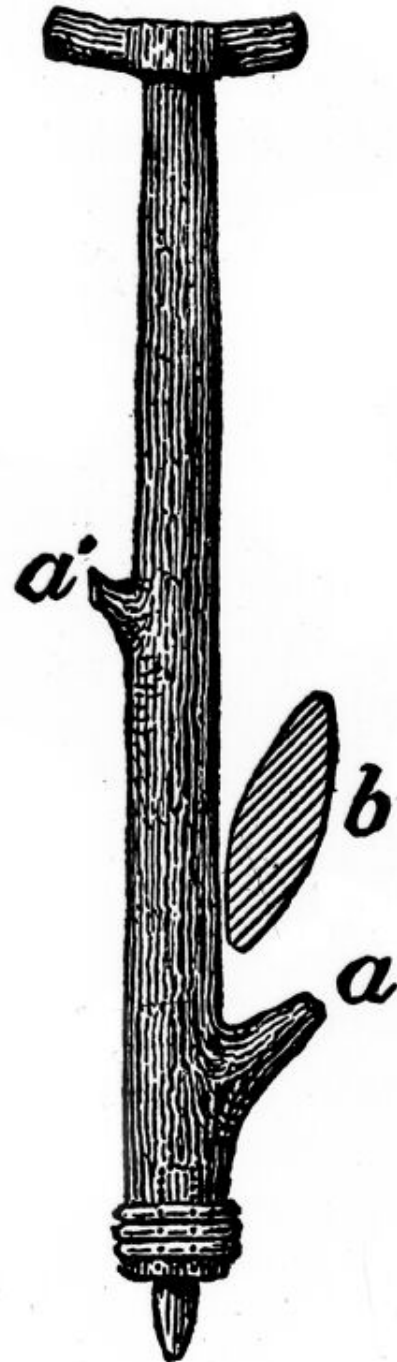


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PLANS FOR A CLASSIFICATION



Flaking-tool — being a shaft or stick, thirty inches to four feet. These were pointed with bone or buck-horn.



Flaking-tool — lower branch utilized to form a crotch in which blow was struck. Upper opposite branch used to secure a heavy stone to give weight and increase the pressure.
