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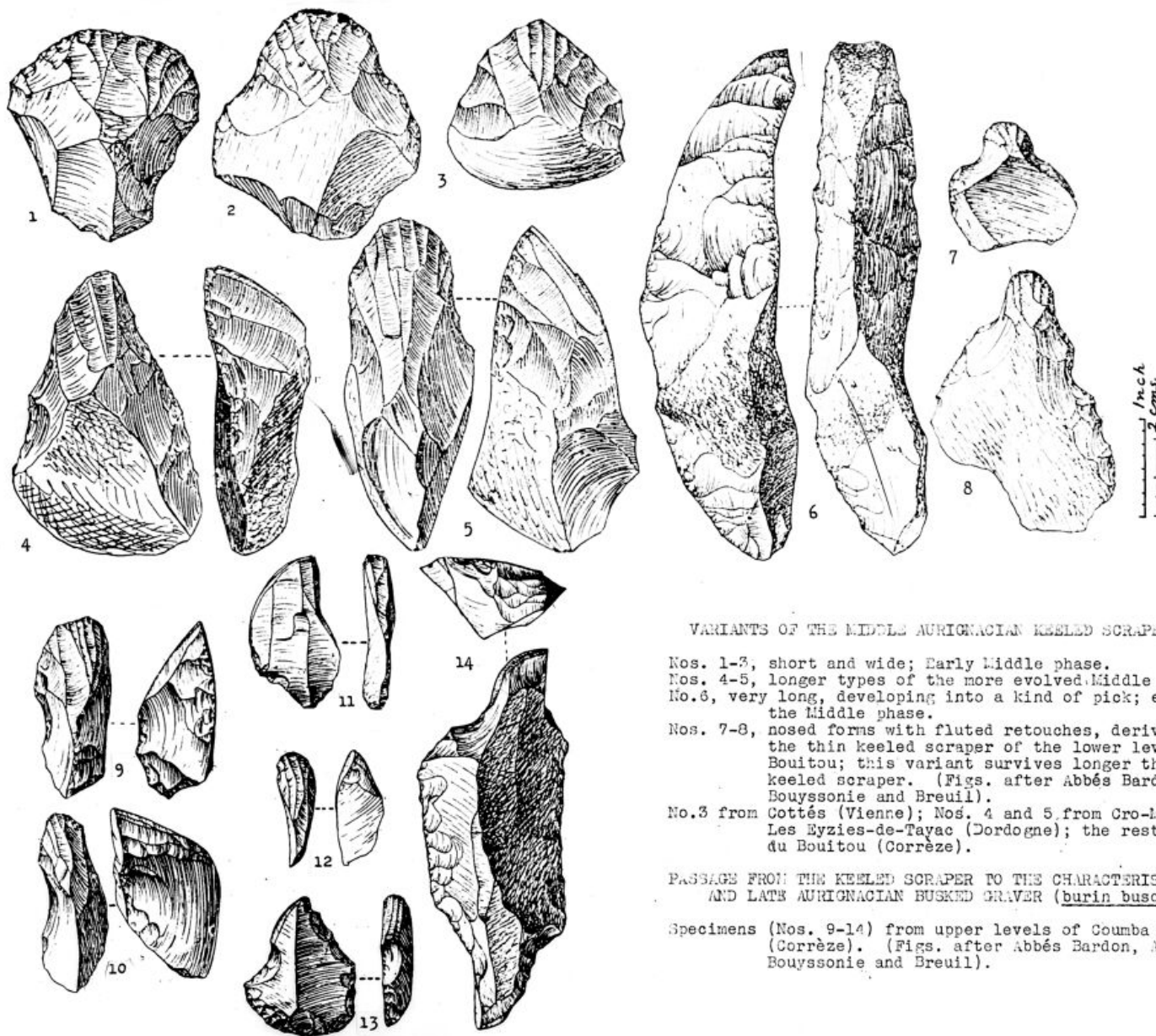
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VARIANTS OF THE MIDDLE AURIGNACIAN KEELED SCRAPER

- Nos. 1-3, short and wide; Early Middle phase.
 Nos. 4-5, longer types of the more evolved Middle phase.
 No. 6, very long, developing into a kind of pick; end of the Middle phase.
 Nos. 7-8, nosed forms with fluted retouches, deriving from the thin keeled scraper of the lower levels of Bouitou; this variant survives longer than the true keeled scraper. (Figs. after Abbés Bardon, A. and J. Bouyssonie and Breuil).
 No. 3 from Cottés (Vienne); Nos. 4 and 5 from Cro-Magnon, Les Eyzies-de-Tayac (Dordogne); the rest from Coumba du Bouitou (Corrèze).
